Take a Summer USTAR Class

Why? Summer USTAR classes allow students to accelerate their progress in math, science and technology. The mathematics and physics classes allow for make-up of missing credit by the quarter. The classes are **free** to JSD students. Summer classes are small and have great JSD teachers. Credit is earned in a short amount of time. For example, the five-week chemistry class counts for an entire year of chemistry in a high school. All the fun stuff is offered: labs, videos, group work and applications to the real world.

Who? Courses vary, some are open to high school students only (any student entering 9th grade in the fall) and some courses are available for 7th and 8th grade students.

This site will direct you to the sign-up locations. Make sure a summer vacation does not interfere with the course; students cannot miss more than 12 hours of class time.

Where? Courses are taught in several middle and high schools in the JSD. The hours are usually 5-6 a day for science classes and 3-4 for mathematics classes.

Registration is open for 8th-12th grade classes and opens May 4 @ 8 a.m. for 7th grade math classes.

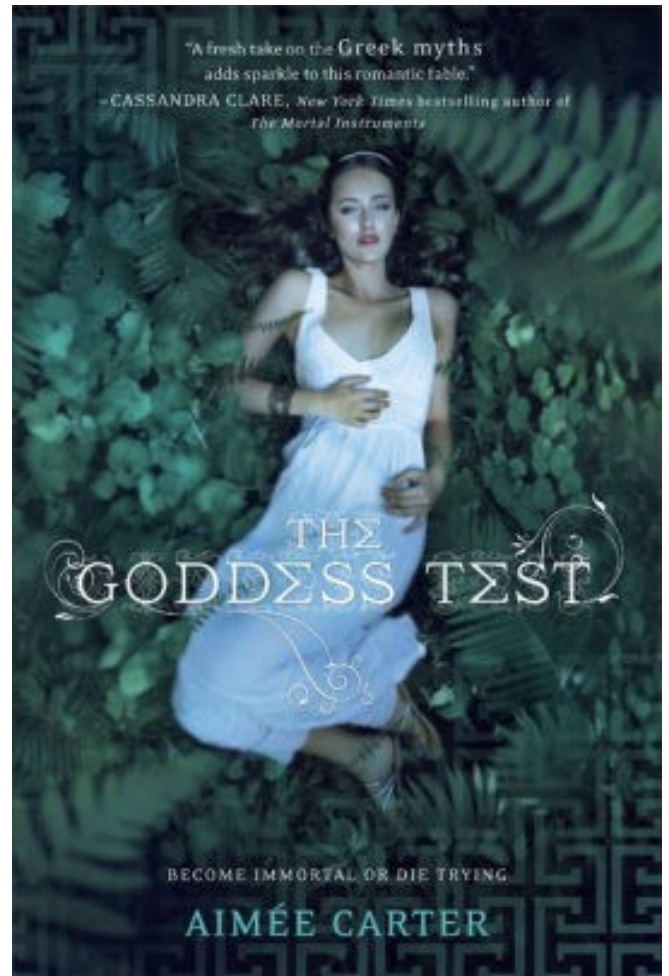
