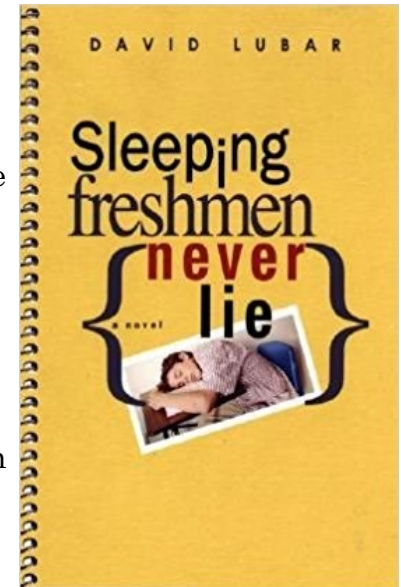

## Book Whisperers

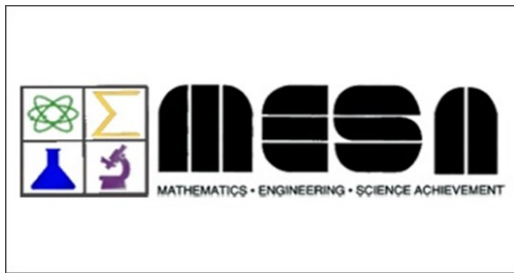
