Counselor's Corner

Bully Prevention

Did you know that October is National Bully Prevention month? What exactly is bullying? Bullying is defined as 1. Someone who attempts to have power over you with intent to hurt. 2. Causing harm, fear, abuse or property damage. 3. Bullying can be verbal, written, physical or electronic.

At Sunset Ridge we have many supports in place to see that every student feels safe in our school. The administration takes all threats of bullying seriously and encourages students who have been bullied or who witness bullying to report to any adult in the building. Students are also able to report bullying anonymously through the SAFEUT app. All bullying, cyberbullying, suicide, relationship difficulties or life challenges are answered by certified counselors 24 hours a day and reported to our administration and counseling office.

We hope that your child feels safe at Sunset Ridge Middle. If for some reason they are being bullied, here are some tips to follow:

- 1. Please make the administration aware so that they can correct the issue.
- 2. Tell your child that it is not their fault. No one deserves to be bullied!
- 3. Explain to your child not to fight back or bully a person back. It won't make things better and it will probably get them into trouble.
- 4. Remind them that "telling" about bullying is not "tattling". It is important to tell someone.
- 5. They should be aware that they shouldn't skip school or avoid friends and activities because they are afraid of the bully. They have every right to be there as much as the bully does.
- 6. Reach out to a school counselor who can speak with your child. They can arrange a student ambassador to help support your student through this time.
