It's called the 2012 Youthlinc Young Humanitarian Award and it's offering a \$5,000 college scholarship to the Utah undergraduate or high school student (9th grader) who most excels at giving back to the community. There are also three \$1,000 runner-up awards.

- -Award applications are **due** Wednesday, March 21, 2012. Received—NOT postmarked by.
- -For the purpose of this award, service is defined as unpaid volunteer efforts which contribute to the well-being of needy individuals or communities.
